When looking at a seating system, there are certain features to consider, such as:

1. Is the system comfortable both physically and psycho-socially?
2. Can the user operate the system independently?
3. How stable is the cushion, particularly if sitting balance is compromised?
4. What kinds of materials are used?
5. Could the materials irritate the skin?
6. Does the system require regular maintenance such as kneading or pumping to work properly?
7. Given the environment, will follow-through occur?
8. How heavy is the system?
9. Will the weight be a burden to the user during self-propulsion or when removing the system?
10. Can the system accommodate or conform to the user to meet their individual needs?
11. What are the thermal characteristics of the system?
12. Do the materials warm or cool according to the external temperature?
13. What kind of effect does this have on the user?
14. What kind of warranty does the manufacturer offer?
